**The Marcellus Shale Coalition, in conjunction with its Midstream and Pipeline Committee and Babst Calland, are pleased to offer a Pipeline Safety Seminar. This training is offered to all oil and gas industry stakeholders.**

The significance of pipeline safety has grown dramatically in recent years, primarily as a result of several high-profile incidents and the development of the nation's shale plays. The U.S. Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) is the federal agency responsible for ensuring the safety of gas and hazardous liquid pipelines and liquefied natural gas (LNG) facilities. PHMSA also administers a grant program that allows states to regulate certain pipelines and LNG facilities in their jurisdictions.

This session will include presentations on current issues in pipeline safety, including an update on the recent developments, a discussion of federal and state enforcement, and an overview of public awareness programs. The seminar will also include a round table discussion with former and current officials on pipeline safety issues confronting the pipeline and midstream sector in the Marcellus and Utica shale plays.
